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

1. Intro: Fairtrade audit (to prepare for becoming a FairAware School)

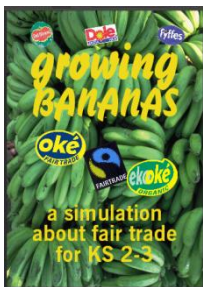

Extension activity – Go bananas photo pack (£9.99) to chart journey of the banana

Resources needed

For Activity 1

Enough copies of the Fairtrade audit for each child to have one

For Activity 2

Scrap paper, coloured pencils/ felts, scissors, photocopies of Chance cards and balance sheet for the Growing Bananas game (see game instructions for more details)

Access to the internet to watch the film clip

For Activity 3

If you are playing Pin the banana on the world map: World maps, blindfolds, banana cut outs, banana growing countries handouts for groups of 4-5 children

If you are playing pass the parcel: A Fairtrade prize wrapped up in layers of newspaper. In each layer put a quiz question. An example of a banana quiz can be found here

If you are playing Fairtrade sense game: A variety of Fairtrade products (eg chocolate, pineapple, grapes) and blindfolds so people have to touch/ taste/ smell them to guess what they are.
